- 1. The development, subject to conditions, is consistent with the objectives of the R1 zone.
- 2. The built form and design are consistent with the streetscape, development in the locality.
- 3. In consideration of the controls of the Inverell Development Control Plan 2013, the development is considered appropriate within the locality.

Terms and Reasons for Conditions

Under section 88(1)(c) of the EP&A Regulation, the consent authority must provide the terms of all conditions and reasons for imposing the conditions other than the conditions prescribed under section 4.17(11) of the EP&A Act. The terms of the conditions and reasons are set out below.

General Conditions

Compliance with Building Code of Australia and insurance requirements under Home Building Act 1989 1. It is a condition of a development consent for development that involves building work that the work must be carried out in accordance with the requirements of the Building Code of Australia. 2. It is a condition of a development consent for development that involves residential building work for which a contract of insurance is required under the Home Building Act 1989, Part 6 that a contract of insurance is in force before building work authorised to be carried out by the consent commences. 3. It is a condition of a development consent for a temporary structure used as an entertainment venue that the temporary structure must comply with Part B1 and NSW Part H102 in Volume 1 of the Building Code of Australia. 4- In subsection (1), a reference to the Building Code of Australia is a reference to the Building Code of Australia as in force on the day on which the application for the construction certificate was made. 5. Before issue of a construction certificate

7	Carport Details
	Prior to issue of a Construction Certificate inclusive of the carport, detailed plans and specifications of the carport are to be submitted to and approved by the Accredited Certifier.
	Condition reason: To ensure the carport is consistent with the development application plans.
8	Section 138 Approval
	Prior to issue of a Construction Certificate inclusive of the carport, approval under Section 138 of the Roads Act 1993 is to be obtained for the installation of the access crossing off Lawrence Street.
	Condition reason: To ensure the necessary approval is obtained for the access crossing.

Before building work commences

9	Construction -Erosion and Sediment Control
	Prior to commencement of works (including earthworks), run-off and erosion control measures must be implemented to prevent soil erosion,
	water pollution and the discharge of loose sediment on the surrounding land. Measures are to include:
	Diverting uncontaminated run-off around cleared or disturbed areas;
	 Erecting a silt fence and providing any other necessary sediment control measures that will prevent debris escaping into drainage systems, waterways or adjoining properties;
	Preventing the tracking of sediment by vehicles onto roads; and
	 Stockpiling top soil, excavated materials, construction and landscaping supplies and debris within the lot.
	Run-off and erosion control measures must be in place for the duration of building work and until adequate (more than 70%) vegetation (grass) cover is established on the site to prevent debris escaping from the site into drainage systems, waterways, adjoining properties and roads. In the
	event that the building contract is completed, it is the responsibility of the owner to maintain the run-off and erosion control measures.
	Condition reason: To ensure sediment laden runoff and site debris do not impact local stormwater systems and waterways.

During building work

10	Hours of work
	Site work must only be carried out between the following times –

From 7.00am to 5.00om on Monday to Saturday Site work is not to be carried out outside of these times except where there is an emergency, or for urgent work directed by a police officer or a public authority. Condition reason: To protect the amenity of the surrounding area. Construction - Local amenity, noise and environmental pollution 11 To safeguard the local amenity, reduce noise nuisance and to prevent environmental pollution during the construction period: ▶ Works on site are to be carried out in accordance with the Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997 in relation to noise, dust and associated nuisances from the site. The carrying out of works shall not interfere with the quiet enjoyment of the surrounding neighbourhood; • Stockpiles of topsoil, sand, aggregate, spoil or other material shall be stored clear of any drainage path of easement, natural watercourse, footpath, kerb or road surface and shall implement measures to prevent the movement of such material off site; · Building operations such as brick cutting, washing tools, concreting and bricklaying shall be undertaken on the building block. The pollutants from these building operations shall be contained on site; ■ Builders waste must not be burnt or buried on site. All waste (including felled trees) must be contained and removed to a waste disposal depot; • Where the proposed development involves the disturbance of any existing survey monuments, those monuments affected will need to be relocated by a registered surveyor under the Surveying and Spatial Information Act 2002. A plan showing the relocated monuments will then be required to be lodged as a matter of public record at the Lands Titles Office. Condition reason: To protect local amenity and survey monuments during construction.

Approved plans and documents means the plans and documents endorsed by the consent authority, a copy of which is included in this notice of determination.

AS means Australian Standard published by Standards Australia International Limited and means the current standard which applies at the time the consent is issued.

Building work means any physical activity involved in the erection of a building.

Certifier means a council or a person that is registered to carry out certification work under the Building and Development Certifiers Act 2018.

Construction certificate means a certificate to the effect that building work completed in accordance with specified plans and specifications or standards will comply with the requirements of the EP&A Regulation and Environmental Planning and Assessment (Development Certification and Fire Safety) Regulation 2021.

Council means INVERELL SHIRE COUNCIL:

Court means the Land and Environment Court of NSW.

EPA means the NSW Environment Protection Authority.

EP&A Act means the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979.

EP&A Regulation means the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2021.

Independent Planning Commission means Independent Planning Commission of New South Wales constituted by section 2.7 of the EP&A Act.

Occupation certificate means a certificate that authorises the occupation and use of a new building or a change of building use for an existing building in

Principal certifier means the certifier appointed as the principal certifier for building work or subdivision work under section 6.6(1) or 6.12(1) of the EP&A Act respectively.

Site work means any work that is physically carried out on the land to which the development the subject of this development consent is to be carried out, including but not limited to building work, subdivision work, demolition work, clearing of vegetation or remediation work.

Stormwater drainage system means all works and facilities relating to:

- the collection of stormwater,
- the reuse of stormwater,
- the detention of stormwater,
- the controlled release of stormwater, and
- connections to easements and public stormwater systems.

Strata certificate means a certificate in the approved form issued under Part 4 of the Strata Schemes Development Act 2015 that authorises the registration of a strata plan, strata plan of subdivision or notice of conversion.

Sydney district or regional planning panel means Northern Regional Planning Panel.
