Terms and Reasons for Conditions

Under section 88(1)(c) of the EP&A Regulation, the consent authority must provide the terms of all conditions and reasons for imposing the conditions other than the conditions prescribed under section 4.17(11) of the EP&A Act. The terms of the conditions and reasons are set out below.

General Conditions

1	<p>Compliance with Building Code of Australia and insurance requirements under Home Building Act 1989</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. It is a condition of a development consent for development that involves building work that the work must be carried out in accordance with the requirements of the Building Code of Australia.2. It is a condition of a development consent for development that involves residential building work for which a contract of insurance is required under the Home Building Act 1989, Part 6 that a contract of insurance is in force before building work authorised to be carried out by the consent commences.3. It is a condition of a development consent for a temporary structure used as an entertainment venue that the temporary structure must comply with Part B1 and NSW Part H102 in Volume 1 of the Building Code of Australia.4. In subsection (1), a reference to the Building Code of Australia is a reference to the Building Code of Australia as in force on the day on which the application for the construction certificate was made.5. In subsection (3), a reference to the Building Code of Australia is a reference to the Building Code of Australia as in force on the day on which the application for development consent was made.6. This section does not apply—<ol style="list-style-type: none">a. to the extent to which an exemption from a provision of the Building Code of Australia or a fire safety standard is in force under the Environmental Planning and Assessment (Development Certification and Fire Safety) Regulation 2021, orb. to the erection of a temporary building, other than a temporary structure to which subsection (3) applies. <p>Condition reason: Prescribed condition under section 69 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2021.</p>
2	<p>Erection of signs</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. This section applies to a development consent for development involving building work, subdivision work or demolition work.2. It is a condition of the development consent that a sign must be erected in a prominent position on a site on which building work, subdivision work or demolition work is being carried out—<ol style="list-style-type: none">a. showing the name, address and telephone number of the principal certifier for the work, and

- d. showing the name of the principal contractor, if any, for the building work and a telephone number on which the principal contractor may be contacted outside working hours, and
 - c. stating that unauthorised entry to the work site is prohibited.
3. The sign must be—
- a. maintained while the building work, subdivision work or demolition work is being carried out, and
 - b. removed when the work has been completed.
4. This section does not apply in relation to—
- a. building work, subdivision work or demolition work carried out inside an existing building, if the work does not affect the external walls of the building, or
 - b. Crown building work certified to comply with the Building Code of Australia under the Act, Part 6.

Condition reason: Prescribed condition under section 70 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2021.

Notification of Home Building Act 1989 requirements

1. This section applies to a development consent for development involving residential building work if the principal certifier is not the council.
2. It is a condition of the development consent that residential building work must not be carried out unless the principal certifier for the development to which the work relates has given the council written notice of the following—
 - a. for work that requires a principal contractor to be appointed—
 - i. the name and licence number of the principal contractor, and
 - ii. the name of the insurer of the work under the Home Building Act 1989, Part 6,
 - b. for work to be carried out by an owner-builder—
 - i. the name of the owner-builder, and
 - ii. if the owner-builder is required to hold an owner-builder permit under the Home Building Act 1989—the number of the owner-builder permit.
3. If the information notified under subsection (2) is no longer correct, it is a condition of the development consent that further work must not be carried out unless the principal certifier has given the council written notice of the updated information.
4. This section does not apply in relation to Crown building work certified to comply with the Building Code of Australia under the Act, Part 6.

Condition reason: Prescribed condition under section 71 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2021.

Before issue of a construction certificate

No additional conditions have been applied to this stage of development.

Before building work commences

6	<p>Construction -Erosion and Sediment Control</p> <p>Prior to commencement of works (including earthworks), run-off and erosion control measures must be implemented to prevent soil erosion, water pollution and the discharge of loose sediment on the surrounding land. Measures are to include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Diverting uncontaminated run-off around cleared or disturbed areas; • Erecting a silt fence and providing any other necessary sediment control measures that will prevent debris escaping into drainage systems, waterways or adjoining properties; • Preventing the tracking of sediment by vehicles onto roads; and • Stockpiling top soil, excavated materials, construction and landscaping supplies and debris within the lot. <p>Run-off and erosion control measures must be in place for the duration of building work and until adequate (more than 70%) vegetation (grass) cover is established on the site to prevent debris escaping from the site into drainage systems, waterways, adjoining properties and roads. In the event that the building contract is completed, it is the responsibility of the owner to maintain the run-off and erosion control measures.</p> <p>Condition reason: To ensure sediment laden runoff and site debris do not impact local stormwater systems and waterways.</p>
7	<p>General Rural Roads Contribution</p> <p>Prior to commencement of works, a General Rural Roads contribution must be paid to Council pursuant to Section 7.11 (formerly Section 94) of the <i>Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979</i> for the dual occupancy.</p> <p>Condition reason: to ensure Rural Road Contribution is paid before works commencement</p>

During building work

8	<p>Construction - Local amenity, noise and environmental pollution</p> <p>To safeguard the local amenity, reduce noise nuisance and to prevent environmental pollution during the construction period:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Works on site are to be carried out in accordance with the Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997 in relation to noise, dust and associated nuisances from the site. The carrying out of works shall not interfere with the quiet enjoyment of the surrounding neighbourhood; • Stockpiles of topsoil, sand, aggregate, spoil or other material shall be stored clear of any drainage path of easement, natural watercourse, footpath, kerb or road surface and shall implement measures to prevent the movement of such material off site; • Building operations such as brick cutting, washing tools, concreting and bricklaying shall be undertaken on the building block. The pollutants from these building operations shall be contained on site;
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- Builders waste must not be burnt or buried on site. All waste (including felled trees) must be contained and removed to a waste disposal depot;
- Where the proposed development involves the disturbance of any existing survey monuments, those monuments affected will need to be relocated by a registered surveyor under the *Surveying and Spatial Information Act 2002*. A plan showing the relocated monuments will then be required to be lodged as a matter of public record at the Lands Titles Office.

Condition reason: To protect local amenity and survey monuments during construction.

Before issue of an occupation certificate

9	<p>Bushfire - Access</p> <p>Prior to issue of an Occupation Certificate the internal driveway is to be an all weather access 4m wide with a vertical clearance of 4m. If the driveway exceeds 200m in length, than a passing bay measuring 20m long by 2m wide is to be provided every 200m. In this regard it is the applicant's responsibility to provide documentary evidence that this condition has been met.</p> <p>Condition reason: To comply with Planning for Bush Fire Protection.</p>
10	<p>Bushfire documentation regarding bushfire in relation to gas and electricity</p> <p>Prior to issue of an Occupation Certificate gas and electricity are to comply with <i>Planning for Bushfire Protection 2019</i>. In this regard it is the applicant's responsibility to provide documentary evidence that this condition has been met.</p> <p>Condition reason: To comply with Planning for Bush Fire Protection</p>
11	<p>Bushfire protection zone</p> <p>Prior to issue of an Occupation Certificate a distance of 20 metres must be provided around the dwelling and maintained in perpetuity as an Asset Protection Zone in accordance with <i>Planning For Bush Fire Protection 2019</i> and the NSW Rural Fire Service document 'Standards for Asset Protection Zones'. In this regard it is the applicant's responsibility to provide documentary evidence that this condition has been met.</p> <p>Condition reason: To comply with Planning for Bush Fire Protection.</p>
12	<p>Bushfire - Water Supply</p> <p>Prior to issue of an Occupation Certificate a 20,000 litre dedicated water supply is to be provided and maintained in perpetuity for the dwelling, with a 65mm storz outlet with a gate or ball valve for connection of a Rural Fire Service tanker. The water supply must be located within the Asset Protection Zone. In this regard it is the applicant's responsibility to provide documentary evidence that this condition has been met</p> <p>Condition reason: To comply with Planning for Bush Fire Protection.</p>
13	<p>Consolidation of Title</p> <p>Prior to issue of an Occupation Certificate consolidated of the lots into a single allotment under one Certificate of Title must occur.</p> <p>Condition reason: Consolidation is required to ensure all lots subject of the development consent are held in the same ownership with no opportunity for fragmented by way of sale or transfer.</p>
14	<p>Occupation of premise</p> <p>Prior to occupation of the premises, an Occupation Certificate must be issued in accordance with <i>Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979</i>.</p>

	<p><i>Note: Prior to issue of the Occupation Certificate, the Principal Certifying Authority is required to be satisfied, amongst other things, that:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • all required inspections (including each applicable mandatory critical stage inspection) have been carried out; and • any preconditions to the issue of the certificate required by a development consent have been met. <p>Condition reason: To ensure an Occupation Certificate is obtained prior to use of the building.</p>
15	<p>Rural addressing</p> <p>Prior to the issue of Occupation Certificate, a rural addressing fee in accordance with Council's fees and charges is to be paid to Council.</p> <p>Condition reason: To provide a road number for formal addressing of the property.</p>
16	<p>Stormwater drainage</p> <p>Prior to issue of an Occupation Certificate, all stormwater (i.e. roof water and/or surface water) shall be drained in accordance with <i>Australian Standard 3500.3 Plumbing and drainage</i>.</p> <p>Condition reason: To ensure stormwater is disposed without causing a nuisance to adjoining properties</p>
17	<p>Notice of Installation</p> <p>Council must be given written notice of the installation of the manufactured home within 7 days after the completion of the installation. The notice must include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The site identifier of the dwelling site on which the relocatable home or associated structure has been installed; and • The particulars contained on each compliance plate relating to the relocatable home or associated structure. <p>The notice must also be accompanied by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A copy of the engineer's certificate for the relocatable home or associated structure; • A fully dimensioned diagram of the dwelling site on which the relocatable home or associated structure is installed, sufficient to indicate whether or not the setback, density, open space and site delineation requirements of this Part have been complied with; • A plumbing and drainage Certificate of Compliance; • an electrical Compliance Certificate; • A water proofing Compliance Certificate; • A glazing Compliance Certificate; • A termite protection Compliance Certificate; and • Bush Fire Attack Level (BAL) Compliance Certificate. <p>Condition reason: To ensure notice of installation is provided with appropriate certification</p>
18	<p>Compliance Plates</p> <p>Prior to occupation of the relocatable dwelling, compliance plate/s are to be attached to the dwelling which contain the following information:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The name of the manufacturer of the manufactured home or associated structure; • The unique identification number for each major section of the manufactured home; • The month and year during which the manufactured home or associated structure was

	<p>constructed;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The design gust wind speed for the manufactured home or associated structure; • A statement that the manufactured home or associated structure complies with the Local Government (Manufactured Home Estates, Caravan Parks, Camping Grounds and Moveable Dwellings) Regulation 2021; and • The name of the practising structural engineer who issued the engineer's certificate for the manufactured home.
	<p>Condition reason: To ensure compliance plates are on the dwellings and show the required information.</p>
19	<p>Onsite Sewage Management System</p> <p>Prior to issue of an Occupation Certificate, a system of onsite sewage management must be installed and operational.</p> <p>Condition reason: To require the dwelling to be connected to a sewage management system.</p>

Occupation and ongoing use

20	<p>APZ Maintained in Perpetuity</p> <p>A distance of 20 metres must be provided around each dwelling and maintained in perpetuity as an Asset Protection Zone in accordance with <i>Planning for Bush Fire Protection</i>.</p> <p>Condition reason: to ensure compliance with PBP 2019</p>
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General advisory notes

This consent contains the conditions imposed by the consent authority which are to be complied with when carrying out the approved development. However, this consent is not an exhaustive list of all obligations which may relate to the carrying out of the development under the EP&A Act, EP&A Regulation and other legislation. The approved development must be carried out in accordance with the conditions of this consent. It is an offence under the EP&A Act to carry out development that is not in accordance with this consent. Building work or subdivision work must not be carried out until a construction certificate or subdivision works certificate, respectively, has been issued and a principal certifier has been appointed.

A document referred to in this consent is taken to be a reference to the version of that document which applies at the date the consent is issued, unless otherwise stated in the conditions of this consent.

Dictionary

The following terms have the following meanings for the purpose of this determination (except where the context clearly indicates otherwise):

Approved plans and documents means the plans and documents endorsed by the consent authority, a copy of which is included in this notice of determination.

AS means Australian Standard published by Standards Australia International Limited and means the current standard which applies at the time the consent is issued.

Building work means any physical activity involved in the erection of a building.

Certifier means a council or a person that is registered to carry out certification work under the *Building and Development Certifiers Act 2018*.

Construction certificate means a certificate to the effect that building work completed in accordance with specified plans and specifications or standards will comply with the requirements of the EP&A Regulation and *Environmental Planning and Assessment (Development Certification and Fire Safety) Regulation 2021*.

Council means INVERELL SHIRE COUNCIL.

Court means the Land and Environment Court of NSW.

EPA means the NSW Environment Protection Authority.

EP&A Act means the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

EP&A Regulation means the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2021*.

Independent Planning Commission means Independent Planning Commission of New South Wales constituted by section 2.7 of the EP&A Act.

Occupation certificate means a certificate that authorises the occupation and use of a new building or a change of building use for an existing building in accordance with this consent.

Principal certifier means the certifier appointed as the principal certifier for building work or subdivision work under section 6.6(1) or 6.12(1) of the EP&A Act respectively.

Site work means any work that is physically carried out on the land to which the development the subject of this development consent is to be carried out, including but not limited to building work, subdivision work, demolition work, clearing of vegetation or remediation work.

Stormwater drainage system means all works and facilities relating to:

- the collection of stormwater,
- the reuse of stormwater,
- the detention of stormwater,
- the controlled release of stormwater, and
- connections to easements and public stormwater systems.

Strata certificate means a certificate in the approved form issued under Part 4 of the *Strata Schemes Development Act 2015* that authorises the registration of a strata plan, strata plan of subdivision or notice of conversion.

Sydney district or regional planning panel means Northern Regional Planning Panel.
