Under section 4.18(1) of the EP&A Act, notice is given that the above development application has been determined by the granting of consent using the power in section 4.16(1)(a) of the EP&A Act, subject to the conditions specified in this notice.

Reasons for approval

1. The development is a Permitted Land Use in the R1 zone pursuant to the Inverell Local Environmental Plan 2012.

2. The development is consistent with the NSW Child Care Planning Guidelines and State Environmental Planning Policy (Transport and Infrastructure) 2021.
3. In consideration to the commercial and parking controls of the Inverell Development Control Plan 2013, the proposed development is suitable for the site and compatible with the locality.
4. The adaptive reuse of the dwelling for a child care centre promotes sustainable development practices and has been designed to be commensurate to the existing area while providing a functional and aesthetic building form and site layout.

Terms and Reasons for Conditions

Under section 88(1)(c) of the EP&A Regulation, the consent authority must provide the terms of all conditions and reasons for imposing the conditions other than the conditions prescribed under section 4.17(11) of the EP&A Act. The terms of the conditions and reasons are set out below.

It is a condition of a development consent for development that involves residential building work for which a contract of insurance is required under the Home Building Act 1989, Part 6 that a contract of insurance is in force before building work authorised to be carried out by the consent commences.3. It is a condition of a development consent for a temporary structure used as an entertainment venue that the temporary structure must comply with Part B1 and NSW Part H102 in Volume 1 of the Building Code of Australia.4. In subsection (1), a reference to the Building Code of Australia is a reference to the Building Code of Australia as in force on the day on which the application for the construction certificate was made.5. 2	<p>Erection of signs</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. This section applies to a development consent for development involving building work, subdivision work or demolition work.2. It is a condition of the development consent that a sign must be erected in a prominent position on a site on which building work, subdivision work or demolition work is being carried out—<ol style="list-style-type: none">a. showing the name, address and telephone number of the principal certifier for the work, and

- v. showing the name of the principal contractor, if any, for the building work and a telephone number on which the principal contractor may be contacted outside working hours, and
 - c. stating that unauthorised entry to the work site is prohibited.
3. The sign must be—
- a. maintained while the building work, subdivision work or demolition work is being carried out, and
 - b. removed when the work has been completed.
4. This section does not apply in relation to—
- a. building work, subdivision work or demolition work carried out inside an existing building, if the work does not affect the external walls of the building, or
 - b. Crown building work certified to comply with the Building Code of Australia under the Act, Part 6.

Condition reason: Prescribed condition under section 70 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2021.

6	Water and Sewer Contributions
	Before the issue of a Construction Certificate, in reliance upon Section 64 of the <i>Local Government Act 1993</i> and Division 5 of Part 2 of Chapter 6 of the <i>Water Management Act 2000</i> , a Certificate of Compliance must be issued by Council for the development and complied with by the developer.
	<i>Note 1: This will likely require payment of a Water Contribution based on 1.7 Equivalent Tenements under Council's Development Servicing Plan No. 1. For the 2023/2024 financial year, the contribution is \$21,250.00.</i>

Before building work commences

11	<p>Construction -Erosion and Sediment Control</p> <p>Prior to commencement of works (including earthworks), run-off and erosion control measures must be implemented to prevent soil erosion, water pollution and the discharge of loose sediment on the surrounding land. Measures are to include:</p>
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- Diverting uncontaminated run-off around cleared or disturbed areas;
- Erecting a silt fence and providing any other necessary sediment control measures that will prevent debris escaping into drainage systems, waterways or adjoining properties;
- Preventing the tracking of sediment by vehicles onto roads; and
- Stockpiling top soil, excavated materials, construction and landscaping supplies and debris within the lot.

Run-off and erosion control measures must be in place for the duration of building work and until adequate (more than 70%) vegetation (grass) cover is established on the site to prevent debris escaping from the site into drainage systems, waterways, adjoining properties and roads. In the event that the building contract is completed, it is the responsibility of the owner to maintain the run-off and erosion control measures.

Condition reason: To ensure sediment laden runoff and site debris do not impact local stormwater systems and waterways.

During building work

12	Construction - Local amenity, noise and environmental pollution
	To safeguard the local amenity, reduce noise nuisance and to prevent environmental pollution during the construction period: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Works on site are to be carried out in accordance with the Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997 in relation to noise, dust and associated nuisances from the site. The carrying out of works shall not interfere with the quiet enjoyment of the surrounding neighbourhood; • Stockpiles of topsoil, sand, aggregate, spoil or other material shall be stored clear of any drainage path of easement, natural watercourse, footpath, kerb or road surface and shall implement measures to prevent the movement of such material off site; • Building operations such as brick cutting, washing tools, concreting and bricklaying shall be undertaken on the building block. All waste (including felled trees) must be contained and removed to a waste disposal depot; • Where the proposed development involves the disturbance of any existing survey monuments, those monuments affected will need to be relocated by a registered surveyor under the <i>Surveying and Spatial Information Act 2002</i>. A plan showing the relocated monuments will then be required to be lodged as a matter of public record at the Lands Titles Office.
	Condition reason: To protect local amenity and survey monuments during construction.
13	Demolition - general
	All demolition work is to be carried out in accordance with <i>Australian Standard 2601 The demolition of structures</i> . Condition reason: All demolition work must comply with Australian Standard 2601.
14	Demolition - Asbestos
	All asbestos waste must be stored, transported, and disposed of in compliance with the Protection of the Environment Operations (Waste) Regulation 2014. Condition reason: Ensure the proper removal, handling, and disposal of asbestos waste.

15	Construction - Survey
	Prior to installation of the acoustic fencing a registered surveyor must identify and peg the boundaries.
	Condition reason: Ensure the fence is constructed on the lot boundary.

16	Occupation of premise

	Condition reason: To require the car park to be constructed as per the approved plans.
18	Stormwater drainage
	Prior to issue of an Occupation Certificate, all stormwater (i.e. roof water and/or surface water) shall be drained in accordance with <i>Australian Standard 3500.3 Plumbing and drainage</i> .
	Condition reason: To ensure stormwater is disposed without causing a nuisance to adjoining properties
19	Fire Safety Schedule
	Before the issue of an Occupation Certificate, the owner of the building must provide Council with a fire safety certificate/s with respect to each fire safety or other safety measures installed within the centre.
	Condition reason: To ensure essential fire safety measures, as per the approved CC plans, are installed within the Centre-Based Child Care Facility.
20	Food safety
	Before the issue of an Occupation Certificate, the premises must be inspected by Council's Environmental Health Officer to ensure compliance with applicable food regulations.
	Condition reason: To ensure that the food preparation area is constructed to the relevant standards.
21	Reinstate unused layback
	Before the issue of an Occupation Certificate, the disused or redundant layback in Andrew

	Street must be removed and reinstated with concrete kerb and gutter or the existing edging profile as specified by Council.
	Condition reason: To protect road side infrastructure and prevent unauthorised access to sites from redundant laybacks.
22	Land consolidation

27	Installation of advertising signs
	Separate approval must be obtained from Council prior to the installation of any advertising signs, other than signs which may be installed as 'Exempt Development' in accordance with <i>State Environmental Planning Policy (Exempt and Complying Development Codes) 2008</i> or Schedule 2 of the <i>Inverell Local Environmental Plan 2012</i> .
	Condition reason: To ensure the necessary development consent is obtained for installation of signage.

The consent should be read together with the Conditions of development consent: advisory notes to ensure the development is carried out lawfully.

The approved development must be carried out in accordance with the conditions of this consent. It is an offence under the EP&A Act to carry out development that is not in accordance with this consent. Building work or subdivision work must not be carried out until a construction certificate or subdivision works certificate, respectively, has been issued and a principal certifier has been appointed.

A document referred to in this consent is taken to be a reference to the version of that document which applies at the date the consent is issued, unless otherwise stated in the conditions of this consent.

Dictionary

The following terms have the following meanings for the purpose of this determination (except where the context clearly indicates otherwise):

Approved plans and documents means the plans and documents endorsed by the consent authority, a copy of which is included in this notice of determination.

AS means Australian Standard published by Standards Australia International Limited and means the current standard which applies at the time the consent is issued.

Building work means any physical activity involved in the erection of a building.

Certifier means a council or a person that is registered to carry out certification work under the *Building and Development Certifiers Act 2018*.

Construction certificate means a certificate to the effect that building work completed in accordance with specified plans and specifications or standards will comply with the requirements of the EP&A Regulation and *Environmental Planning and Assessment (Development Certification and Fire Safety) Regulation 2021*.

Council means INVERELL SHIRE COUNCIL.

Court means the Land and Environment Court of NSW.

EPA means the NSW Environment Protection Authority.

EP&A Act means the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

EP&A Regulation means the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2021*.

Independent Planning Commission means Independent Planning Commission of New South Wales constituted by section 2.7 of the EP&A Act.

Occupation certificate means a certificate that authorises the occupation and use of a new building or a change of building use for an existing building in accordance with this consent.

Principal certifier means the certifier appointed as the principal certifier for building work or subdivision work under section 6.6(1) or 6.12(1) of the EP&A Act respectively.

Site work means any work that is physically carried out on the land to which the development the subject of this development consent is to be carried out, including but not limited to building work, subdivision work, demolition work, clearing of vegetation or remediation work.

Stormwater drainage system means all works and facilities relating to:

- the collection of stormwater,
- the reuse of stormwater,
- the detention of stormwater,
- the controlled release of stormwater, and
- connections to easements and public stormwater systems.

Strata certificate means a certificate in the approved form issued under Part 4 of the *Strata Schemes Development Act 2015* that authorises the registration of a strata plan, strata plan of subdivision or notice of conversion.

Sydney district or regional planning panel means Northern Regional Planning Panel.
