



Rock and Tempest by Patricia Collins


When Cyclone Tracy flattened Darwin on Christmas Day 1974, it was the worst natural disaster Australians had ever experienced. People sat huddled in doorways and bathtubs as the winds raged, lifting off roofs, picking up cars and sinking ships. Stationed in the city with the Women's Royal Australian Naval Service, Patricia Collins not only lived through Tracy but was part of the massive clean-up effort. This is her extraordinary story.



The Consultant by Jay Malkoun

Jay Malkoun isn't the type of man who lets a little thing like being blown up slow him down.

In March 2019, a car bomb outside his gym detonated the Mercedes Jay was inside. It was an explosion heard around the world, as global media, law enforcement agencies and underworld cartels speculated on who had moved to assassinate the former gangster and retired leader of one of the world's most feared and powerful underworld organisations. There were hundreds of possible suspects. Jay has some ideas about it too.



My beautiful sisters by Khalida Popal

August 2021: Kabul falls to the Taliban. Overnight life changes for women across Afghanistan. The national women's football team faces an imminent threat to their lives, just for playing sport. For Khalida Popal, the team's first captain and co-founder, this is not an unprecedented event. Born in Afghanistan, as a child she fled Taliban rule with her family and grew up in a refugee camp in Pakistan. Over the years Popal found herself as a refugee in Denmark, working to uncover widespread sexual abuse of players by the former president of the Afghanistan Football Federation, forcing FIFA and the government of Afghanistan to act. When Kabul falls, Khalida is safe but many of her teammates are left behind. Against all odds, she works with a small group of allies to orchestrate an international evacuation strategy to save them.




NEW BOOKS

The Lyrebird Lake Ladies Choir by Sandie Docker

Sisters Eleanor and Maggie have been running the Lyrebird Lake Ladies Choir for fifteen years. It has become a haven for the lost and lonely women who have found their home in the stately federation house by the lake. When Eleanor enters the choir into the All Voices Championship, it offers them all a chance to make up for lost dreams.

Single mum Hannah arrives in Lyrebird Lake, homeless after being widowed and hoping for a new start with her son. With her angelic voice, Hannah could give the choir a winning edge. But when Eleanor hears her singing a long-forgotten lullaby, she is transported to her past, a traumatic time when two teenage girls were banished from their Irish homeland to a faraway country.

Will Hannah's arrival mend old wounds, or will the secret she unknowingly carries tear the sisters apart?





An Enchanting Case of Spirits by Melissa Holtz

Alyssa Mann isn't adventurous, not since her husband died and she found herself the single mom of a teenage daughter. But there's no way to avoid celebrating the big four-o, so when her best friends drag her out for drinks and a tarot reading, she throws caution to the wind and decides to see what the spirits have to say. It's all fun and games until she wakes up the next morning with a wicked hangover - and a ghost standing at the end of her bed. Sheer panic sends her running for help from Nick West, the (very) attractive detective who lives next door. When he finds no one in her house, Alyssa has to accept that she really did see a ghost. As the dearly departed keep appearing, Alyssa and her friends do their best to learn how to control her new-found power. Trading insults with ghosts, returning family heirlooms, and getting closer to the skeptical (but helpful) Nick is more fun than Alyssa imagined. But when looking into one ghost's past reveals unexpected - and unwelcome-facts about Alyssa's late husband's death, she discovers she just may be in over her head.





CHRIS HAMMER

Award-winning Author

Chris Hammer is a leading Australian crime fiction novelist, author of the internationally bestselling Martin Scarsden series: 'Scrublands', 'Silver' and 'Trust'.

Chris's current award-winning series features homicide detectives Nell Buchanan and Ivan Lucic: 'Treasure & Dirt' (or Opal Country); The Tilt (or Dead Man's Creek); The Seven (or Cover The Bones); and now The Valley (or The Broken River). 'Scrublands' was an instant bestseller upon publication in 2018, topping the Australian fiction charts.

It was shortlisted for major writing awards in Australia, the UK and the United States. In the UK it was named the Sunday Times Crime Novel of the Year 2019 and won the prestigious UK Crime Writers' Association John Creasey New Blood Dagger Award.

'Scrublands', 'Silver' and 'Trust' all feature troubled journalist Martin Scarsden and his partner Mandalay Blonde, while the next four novels follow homicide detectives Ivan Lucic and Nell Buchanan.


Chris's books are well known for their atmospheric Australian settings, a range of colourful characters, intricate plots, descriptive language and emotional depth. Before turning to fiction, Chris was a journalist for more than thirty years. He reported from more than 30 countries on six continents for SBS TV. In Canberra, roles included chief political correspondent for The Bulletin, senior writer for The Age and Online Political Editor for The Age and The Sydney Morning Herald.

Chris has written two non-fiction books 'The River' (2010) – winner of the ACT Book of the Year – and 'The Coast' (2012), published by Melbourne University Press.

He has a bachelor's degree in Journalism from Charles Sturt University and a master's degree in International Relations from the Australian National University. He lives in Canberra, Australia.

Protecting Your Personal Information Online


