



## NOTICE OF DETERMINATION OF A DEVELOPMENT APPLICATION

Under section 4.18(1) of the EP&A Act, notice is given that the above development application has been determined by the granting of consent using the power in section 4.16(1)(a) of the EP&A Act, subject to the conditions specified in this notice.

### Reasons for approval

- <sup>1</sup>. The development, subject to conditions, is consistent with the objectives of the R1 General Residential zone.
- <sup>2</sup>. The built form and design of the alfresco and swimming pool, subject to conditions is consistent with the streetscape and development in the area.
- <sup>3</sup>. In consideration of the controls of the Inverell Development Control Plan 2013, the development is considered appropriate within the locality.

## **Request a review**

You may request a review of the consent authority's decision under section 8.3(1) of the EP&A Act. The application must be made to the consent authority within 6 months from the date that you received the original determination notice provided that an appeal under section 8.7 of the EP&A Act has not been disposed of by the Court.

## **Rights to appeal**

You have a right under section 8.7 of the EP&A Act to appeal to the Court within 6 months after the date on which the determination appealed against is notified or registered on the NSW planning portal.

## Terms and Reasons for Conditions

Under section 88(1)(c) of the EP&A Regulation, the consent authority must provide the terms of all conditions and reasons for imposing the conditions other than the conditions prescribed under section 4.17(11) of the EP&A Act. The terms of the conditions and reasons are set out below.

### General Conditions

It is a condition of a development consent for development that involves residential building work for which a contract of insurance is required under the Home Building Act 1989, Part 6 that a contract of insurance is in force before building work authorised to be carried out by the consent commences.</li><li>3. It is a condition of a development consent for a temporary structure used as an entertainment venue that the temporary structure must comply with Part B1 and NSW Part H102 in Volume 1 of the Building Code of Australia.</li><li>4. In subsection (1), a reference to the Building Code of Australia is a reference to the Building Code of Australia as in force on the day on which the application for the construction certificate was made.</li><li>5. 	<p><b>Condition reason:</b> Prescribed condition under section 70 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2021.</p>
3	<p><b>Fulfilment of BASIX commitments</b></p> <p>It is a condition of a development consent for the following that each commitment listed in a relevant BASIX certificate is fulfilled—</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. In the event of any inconsistency with the approved plans and a condition of this consent, the condition prevails.

**Condition reason:** To ensure all parties are aware of the approved plans and supporting documentation that applies to the development.

**6 Construction Certificate required prior to commencement of works on site**

No activity is to be carried out on site until a Construction Certificate has been issued, other than:

- site investigation for the preparation of the construction; and/or
- implementation of environmental protection measures, such as erosion control etc. that are required by this consent.

**Condition reason:** To ensure no works commence until a Construction Certificate has been issued and any pre-construction conditions have been satisfied.

**7 Section 68 - Approvals**

Prior to issue of a Construction Certificate, approval under Section 68 of the Local Government Act 1993 is to be obtained for:

- Sewerage works;
- Water supply works;
- Stormwater drainage works; and

Disposal of liquid trade waste to sewer (food preparation areas).

**Condition reason:** To ensure that the necessary Local Government Act 1993 approvals are obtained for this development.

## Building Work

### Before issue of a construction certificate

<b>8</b>	<b>Pool Specifications</b>
	Prior to the issue of a Construction Certificate, pool specifications will need to be provided.
	<b>Condition reason:</b> To ensure pool specifications are provided prior to the issue of a Construction Certificate.

### Before building work commences

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**Construction -Erosion and Sediment Control**

Prior to commencement of works (including earthworks), run-off and erosion control measures must be implemented to prevent soil erosion, water pollution and the discharge of loose sediment on the surrounding land. Measures are to include:

- Diverting uncontaminated run-off around cleared or disturbed areas;
- Erecting a silt fence and providing any other necessary sediment control measures that will prevent debris escaping into drainage systems, waterways or adjoining properties;
- Preventing the tracking of sediment by vehicles onto roads; and
- Stockpiling top soil, excavated materials, construction and landscaping supplies and debris within the lot.

Run-off and erosion control measures must be in place for the duration of building work and until adequate (more than 70%) vegetation (grass) cover is established on the site to prevent debris escaping from the site into drainage systems, waterways, adjoining properties and roads. In the event that the building contract is completed, it is the responsibility of the owner to maintain the run-off and erosion control measures.

**Condition reason:** To ensure sediment laden runoff and site debris do not impact local stormwater systems and waterways.

**During building work**

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**Hours of work**

Site work must only be carried out between the following times –

From 7:00am to 5:00pm on Monday to Saturday

Site work is not to be carried out outside of these times except where there is an emergency, or for urgent work directed by a police officer or a public authority.

**Condition reason:** To protect the amenity of the surrounding area.

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**Construction - Local amenity, noise and environmental pollution**

To safeguard the local amenity, reduce noise nuisance and to prevent environmental pollution during the construction period:

- Works on site are to be carried out in accordance with the Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997 in relation to noise, dust and associated nuisances from the site. The carrying out of works shall not interfere with the quiet enjoyment of the surrounding neighbourhood;
- Stockpiles of topsoil, sand, aggregate, spoil or other material shall be stored clear of any drainage path of easement, natural watercourse, footpath, kerb or road surface and shall implement measures to prevent the movement of such material off site;
- Building operations such as brick cutting, washing tools, concreting and bricklaying shall be undertaken on the building block. The pollutants from these building operations shall be contained on site;
- Builders waste must not be burnt or buried on site. All waste (including felled trees) must be contained and removed to a waste disposal depot;

Where the proposed development involves the disturbance of any existing survey monuments, those monuments affected will need to be relocated by a registered

surveyor under the *Surveying and Spatial Information Act 2002*. A plan showing the relocated monuments will then be required to be lodged as a matter of public record at the Lands Titles Office.

**Condition reason:** To protect local amenity and survey monuments during construction.

### Before issue of an occupation certificate

12	<p><b>Occupation of premise</b></p> <p>Prior to occupation of the premises, an Occupation Certificate must be issued in accordance with <i>Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979</i>.</p> <p><i>Note: Prior to issue of the Occupation Certificate, the Principal Certifying Authority is required to be satisfied, amongst other things, that:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• all required inspections (including each applicable mandatory critical stage inspection) have been carried out; and</li> <li>• any preconditions to the issue of the certificate required by a development consent have been met.</li> </ul> <p><b>Condition reason:</b> To ensure an Occupation Certificate is obtained prior to use of the building.</p>

14	<p><b>Swimming pool- child – restraint barrier</b></p> <p>To comply with the <i>Swimming Pools Act 1992</i> the owner of the premises on which a swimming pool is situated must ensure that the swimming pool is at all times surrounded by a child-resistant barrier:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• that separates the swimming pool from any residential building situated on the premises and from any place (whether public or private) adjoining the premises; and</li> <li>• that is designed, constructed, installed and maintained in accordance with the regulations and <i>Australian Standard 1926-2007 Swimming pool safety</i>.</li> </ul> <p><b>Condition reason:</b> To comply with the Swimming Pools Act 1992</p>
15	<p><b>Swimming pool - external lighting</b></p> <p>Any external pool lighting shall be positioned and shielded to prevent a glare nuisance to neighbouring premises.</p> <p><b>Condition reason:</b> To protect the amenity of adjoining properties.</p>
16	<p><b>Swimming pool filtration equipment amenity</b></p> <p>The swimming pool filtration equipment is to be located so as to prevent the possibility of any offensive noise to adjoining or nearby residences.</p> <p><b>Condition reason:</b> To protect the amenity of adjoining properties</p>
17	<p><b>Swimming pool – Resuscitation poster</b></p> <p>A resuscitation techniques flow sequence sign/poster is to be displayed in a prominent position adjacent to the pool. The sequence must be in accordance with the Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation Guideline, illustrated by drawings with key words only in bold print, and contain a</p>

	statement to the effect that formal instruction in resuscitation is also essential. The sign shall comply with the other relevant guidelines of the Australian Resuscitation Council and include the name of the teaching organisation or other body that published the sign and the date of its publication.
	<b>Condition reason:</b> To comply with the Swimming Pools Act 1992.
18	<b>Swimming pool - waste water</b>
	Swimming pool wastewater must be drained to Council's sewer in accordance with the requirements of Council and <i>Australian Standard 3500.2 Plumbing and drainage</i> .
	<b>Condition reason:</b> To require appropriate disposal of pool wastewater.

### Occupation and ongoing use

No additional conditions have been applied to this stage of development.

### Demolition Work

#### Before demolition work commences

No additional conditions have been applied to this stage of development.

#### During demolition work

19	<b>Demolition - asbestos</b>
	If the development is found to contain asbestos: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The applicant/builder must investigate, and carry out, their obligations as specified under the <i>Work Health and Safety Regulation 2011</i>; and</li> <li>• All asbestos waste must be stored, transported and disposed of in accordance with the <i>Protection of the Environment Operations (Waste) Regulation 1996</i>.</li> </ul>
	<b>Condition reason:</b> To require asbestos is handled, transported and disposed in accordance with the relevant legislation.
20	<b>Demolition - Australian Standards</b>
	All demolition work is to be carried out in accordance with <i>Australian Standard 2601 The demolition of structures</i> .
	<b>Condition reason:</b> All demolition work must comply with Australian Standard 2601.
21	<b>Demolition - Supervision</b>
	At all times during demolition a competent person shall directly supervise work. It is the responsibility of the person to ensure that: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The structure to be demolished and all its components shall be maintained in a stable and safe condition at all stages of the demolition work;</li> <li>• Precautions are to be taken to ensure that the stability of all parts of the structure and the safety of persons on and outside the site are maintained particularly in the event of sudden and severe weather changes; and</li> <li>• The site shall be sealed off at all times against the unauthorised entry of persons or vehicles.</li> </ul>
	<b>Condition reason:</b> To protect adjoining properties and public safety.

### On completion of demolition work

22	<b>Removal of waste upon completion</b>
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	<p><b>After completion of all site work:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. all refuse, spoil and material unsuitable for use on-site must be removed from the site and disposed of in accordance with the approved waste management plan; and</li> <li>b. written evidence of the waste removal must be provided to the satisfaction of the Inverell Shire Council.</li> </ul> <p><b>Condition reason: To ensure waste material is appropriately disposed or satisfactorily stored.</b></p>
23	<p><b>Repair of infrastructure</b></p> <p><b>After completion of all site work:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. any public infrastructure damaged as a result of the carrying out of work approved under this consent (including damage caused by, but not limited to, delivery vehicles, waste collection, contractors, sub-contractors, concreting vehicles) must be fully repaired to the written satisfaction of Council, and at no cost to Council; or</li> <li>b. if the works in (a) are not carried out to Council's satisfaction, Council may carry out the works required and the costs of any such works must be paid as directed by Council and in the first instance will be paid using the security deposit required to be paid under this consent.</li> </ul> <p><b>Condition reason: To ensure any damage to public infrastructure is rectified.</b></p>

### General advisory notes

This consent contains the conditions imposed by the consent authority which are to be complied with when carrying out the approved development. However, this consent is not an exhaustive list of all obligations which may relate to the carrying out of the development under the EP&A Act, EP&A Regulation and other legislation. Some of these additional obligations are set out in the [Conditions of development consent: advisory notes](#). The consent should be read together with the *Conditions of development consent: advisory notes* to ensure the development is carried out lawfully.

The approved development must be carried out in accordance with the conditions of this consent. It is an offence under the EP&A Act to carry out development that is not in accordance with this consent. Building work or subdivision work must not be carried out until a construction certificate or subdivision works certificate, respectively, has been issued and a principal certifier has been appointed.

A document referred to in this consent is taken to be a reference to the version of that document which applies at the date the consent is issued, unless otherwise stated in the conditions of this consent.

## Dictionary

The following terms have the following meanings for the purpose of this determination (except where the context clearly indicates otherwise):

**Approved plans and documents** means the plans and documents endorsed by the consent authority, a copy of which is included in this notice of determination.

**AS** means Australian Standard published by Standards Australia International Limited and means the current standard which applies at the time the consent is issued.

**Building work** means any physical activity involved in the erection of a building.

**Certifier** means a council or a person that is registered to carry out certification work under the *Building and Development Certifiers Act 2018*.

**Construction certificate** means a certificate to the effect that building work completed in accordance with specified plans and specifications or standards will comply with the requirements of the EP&A Regulation and *Environmental Planning and Assessment (Development Certification and Fire Safety) Regulation 2021*.

**Council** means INVERELL SHIRE COUNCIL.

**Court** means the Land and Environment Court of NSW.

**EPA** means the NSW Environment Protection Authority.

**EP&A Act** means the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

**EP&A Regulation** means the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2021*.

**Independent Planning Commission** means Independent Planning Commission of New South Wales constituted by section 2.7 of the EP&A Act.

**Occupation certificate** means a certificate that authorises the occupation and use of a new building or a change of building use for an existing building in accordance with this consent.

**Principal certifier** means the certifier appointed as the principal certifier for building work or subdivision work under section 6.6(1) or 6.12(1) of the EP&A Act respectively.

**Site work** means any work that is physically carried out on the land to which the development the subject of this development consent is to be carried out, including but not limited to building work, subdivision work, demolition work, clearing of vegetation or remediation work.

**Stormwater drainage system** means all works and facilities relating to:

- the collection of stormwater,
- the reuse of stormwater,
- the detention of stormwater,
- the controlled release of stormwater, and
- connections to easements and public stormwater systems.

**Strata certificate** means a certificate in the approved form issued under Part 4 of the *Strata Schemes Development Act 2015* that authorises the registration of a strata plan, strata plan of subdivision or notice of conversion.

**Sydney district or regional planning panel** means Northern Regional Planning Panel.
